

# Blue Flag – The Metabolic Mover & Lymphatic Clarifier

## Botanical Profile

- Latin Name: *Iris versicolor*
- Alternative Names: Larger Blue Flag, Harlequin Blue Flag
- Plant Family: Iridaceae
- Parts Used: Rhizome (dried)
- Origin: Native to North America, especially wet meadows and streambanks

Blue Flag is a potent, low-dose alterative herb prized for its ability to move stagnation in the lymphatic system, liver, and glandular tissues. Known for supporting detoxification and clearing skin eruptions, it's particularly valued where there is dullness, puffiness, or metabolic sluggishness. At Peridotflow, we respect Blue Flag as a fierce but focused plant ally—used carefully and intentionally to help shift what is stuck, clarify what is foggy, and release what the body no longer needs.

## **Supports Liver Detoxification and Glandular Function**

Blue Flag is a strong hepatic alterative, meaning it stimulates liver detoxification and enhances the clearance of metabolic waste. It's particularly useful when the liver is congested and overburdened—reflected in hormonal imbalances, digestive stagnation, or chronic skin eruptions. In small doses, Blue Flag acts as a catalyst to help reawaken the liver's processing power and can assist in conditions like sluggish digestion, hormonal acne, and PMS.

## **Moves Lymph and Clears Puffiness**

This herb excels at shifting lymphatic stagnation, especially when there is puffiness, water retention, or visible signs of poor lymph flow like acne, dull skin, or swollen glands. It's especially useful in metabolic-type stagnation that's slow, thick, and cold—seen in hypothyroid conditions, chronic fatigue, or swollen nodes. It pairs beautifully with Cleavers or Red Clover for a more balanced lymphatic effect.

## **Clarifies the Skin from Within**

Blue Flag's alterative action helps clear skin eruptions—particularly those linked to liver and lymph burden. It is commonly used in formulations for eczema, acne, and other chronic inflammatory skin conditions where internal stagnation is the root cause. It is a 'blood purifier' in traditional language, shifting internal toxicity through increased elimination and detoxification pathways.

## Regulates Metabolism and Thyroid Function

In low doses and with caution, Blue Flag has been historically used to support the thyroid—particularly in cases of hypothyroidism with weight gain, dry skin, and fatigue. It is said to support sluggish glandular function and promote metabolism, though its use for this purpose is less common today. Always use under the guidance of a practitioner when addressing thyroid conditions.

## Eases Chronic Congestion and Sluggishness

Blue Flag shines in cases where the system feels boggy, slow, and overburdened—particularly after long-term exposure to toxins, rich food, or inactivity. It acts as a gentle prod to the system, helping the body to reboot elimination pathways. Use is best suited to Kapha or Kapha-Pitta constitutions needing a nudge toward clarity and movement.

## Folklore & History

Blue Flag was widely used by Native American tribes and early American herbalists for its purifying and detoxifying properties. It was considered a ‘clearing’ herb—suitable for conditions of damp, stagnation, and fullness. Although rarely used in modern mainstream herbalism, Blue Flag held a place in many classic alterative formulas and was even used in early thyroid remedies. Its bold blue flowers hide a potent root with fierce detoxifying energy.

## Traditional Usage

Blue Flag has been used as a low-dose alterative in traditional Western herbalism, most commonly in tincture form. It was often included in blood-cleansing and skin-support formulas. It should always be dried before use and never consumed fresh due to potential toxicity. Ideal in small amounts for metabolic sluggishness, lymphatic congestion, and dull skin conditions.

## Herbal Actions

Alterative, Lymphagogue, Hepatic, Thyroid Supportive (mild), Diuretic, Emetic (in high doses)

## Energetics & Tissue States

Temperature: Cooling

Moisture: Drying

Tissue States: Damp/Stagnant, Atrophic, Cold, Sluggish, Swollen

## Active Compounds

- Iridin – stimulates liver and digestion
- Volatile oils – antimicrobial and circulatory
- Resinous compounds – detoxifying
- Alkaloids (trace) – contribute to bitter, moving properties

## Dosage & Preparation

- Tincture: 0.5–1 ml up to 2x daily (low-dose)
- Not recommended as tea due to potential irritation
- Always use dried root and consult guidance before internal use

## Safety & Contraindications

- Do not use fresh root—it is toxic in raw form
- Avoid in pregnancy and breastfeeding
- High doses may cause nausea or vomiting
- Not for long-term use unless directed by a professional

## Herbal Pairings

- Cleavers – gentle lymphatic mover
- Red Clover – blood purifier and hormonal balance
- Dandelion Root – liver and digestion synergy
- Burdock – skin, blood, and detox support
- Calendula – lymph, gut, and skin harmony
