- Alternative Names: Mexican Damiana, Old Woman's Broom
- Plant Family: Passifloraceae (formerly Turneraceae)
- Parts Used: Leaves
- Origin: Native to Central and South America, Mexico, and the Caribbean

Damiana is a warming, stimulating tonic herb long treasured for its ability to uplift the spirit, spark libido, and relax tension held in both body and mind. Known as a lover's herb and a soul brightener, it supports nervous system vitality and reproductive energy, while also calming digestive unease rooted in emotion. At Peridotflow, we honour Damiana as a sensual tonic for heart, mood, and embodiment.

Enhances Mood and Relieves Low Spirits

Damiana is well-known for its mood-lifting properties. It brings a lightness to the emotional body and eases mild depression, anxiety, or apathy—especially when rooted in nervous or hormonal imbalances. Its effect is subtle but tangible, gently awakening joy and confidence while reducing emotional stagnation. In Vitalist practice, Damiana is often used when the spirit feels dulled or disconnected from pleasure and vitality.

Supports Libido and Sexual Vitality

Traditionally regarded as an aphrodisiac, Damiana works by supporting both circulation and nervous system engagement in the pelvic region. It increases sexual desire and responsiveness, especially in cases where emotional stress, fatigue, or low mood are contributing to lowered libido. Its tonifying action is balanced—stimulating yet not overly heating—and it is suitable for both men and women as part of a reproductive tonic blend.

Eases Nervous Tension and Frustration

Damiana is both a nervine and a mild stimulant—helping to calm an overworked mind while lifting low or sluggish states. It is ideal when there is nervous exhaustion, restlessness, or irritability paired with low energy or poor sleep. It is especially helpful in those with Vata-Pitta imbalances where overthinking meets emotional burnout.

Promotes Digestive Comfort and Reduces Bloating

As a carminative and digestive relaxant, Damiana helps settle tension and bloating in the gut—particularly where digestion is sensitive to emotional states. It gently encourages

digestive fire while relaxing the nervous system and gut lining, restoring flow and comfort. It is helpful in blends for IBS-like presentations where tension underlies symptoms.

Supports Hormonal and Reproductive Balance

Damiana is a gentle endocrine modulator, particularly helpful in cases of low libido associated with perimenopause or hormonal imbalance. Its toning action on the reproductive system—paired with mood-brightening and nervine qualities—make it an excellent support for the emotional and sensual wellbeing of women during hormonal transition.

Folklore & History

Damiana has been used for centuries by Indigenous peoples of Central and South America as a tonic for sexual health, mood, and the nervous system. The Mayans revered it for its aphrodisiac properties and brewed it as a love potion. In Mexican folk medicine, it was also used for women's reproductive issues, digestive complaints, and as a calming tonic for the nerves.

Traditional Usage

Traditionally prepared as a tea, tincture, or infused liqueur. Often smoked ceremonially to calm nerves and increase sensual presence. Combined with other aphrodisiac herbs or nervines in love blends and uplifting formulas.

Herbal Actions

Aphrodisiac, Nervine Tonic, Antidepressant (mild), Carminative, Digestive Relaxant, Endocrine Supportive

Energetics & Tissue States

Temperature: Warming

Moisture: Drying

Tissue States: Depressed, Atrophic, Stagnant, Tense

Active Compounds

- Flavonoids – antioxidant and mood supportive
- Terpenes – stimulating and aphrodisiac properties
- Alkaloids – nervous system modulation
- Volatile oils – digestive support

Dosage & Preparation

- Tea: 1–2 tsp dried leaf per cup, steep 10–15 mins
- Tincture: 2–4 ml up to 3x daily
- Smoking: Used occasionally in ceremonial or sensual blends
- Liqueur: Traditional method in love tonics and bitters

Safety & Contraindications

- Not recommended during pregnancy
- Avoid in high doses for those with insomnia or sensitivity to stimulation
- Generally safe in moderate use for adults
- May interact with medications that affect hormones or the nervous system

Herbal Pairings

- Muira Puama – stronger aphrodisiac effects
- Passionflower – emotional and sexual harmony
- Maca – endocrine and vitality boost
- Lemon Balm – mood elevation with calming
- Ginger – circulatory stimulation with grounding
